- The ceremony will take place rain or shine. The stadium is not covered. Please plan your clothing and footwear accordingly. Please do not wear spiked heels into the stadium.
- In the case of rain, complimentary ponchos will be available and the ceremony may be shortened.
- The ceremony will also be simulcast in McConomy Auditorium, University Center. No tickets are required and seating is first come, first served.
- The ceremony will be webcast on the commencement website.
- Graduates will receive their diplomas at their department or school's diploma ceremony; see page 4 for details.

Parking

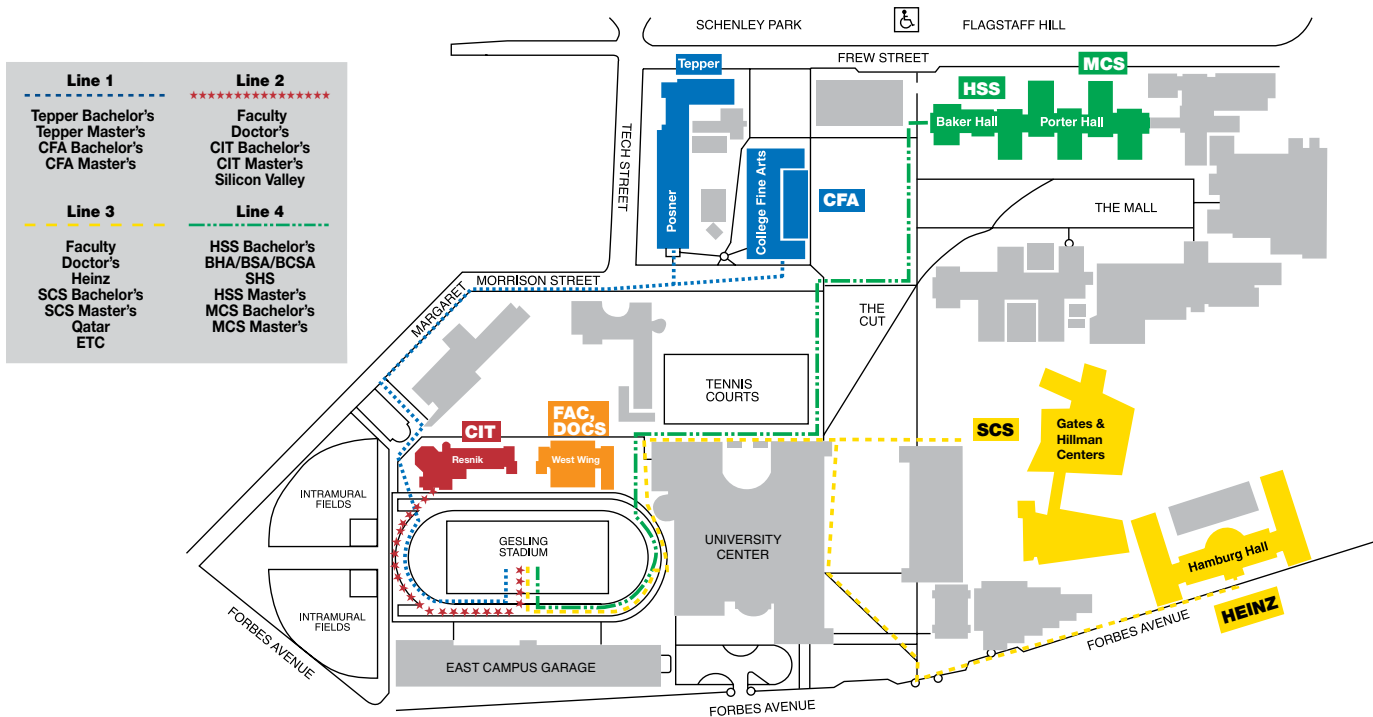
Guidelines for Wearing Academic Regalia

- Male graduation candidates and faculty should remove

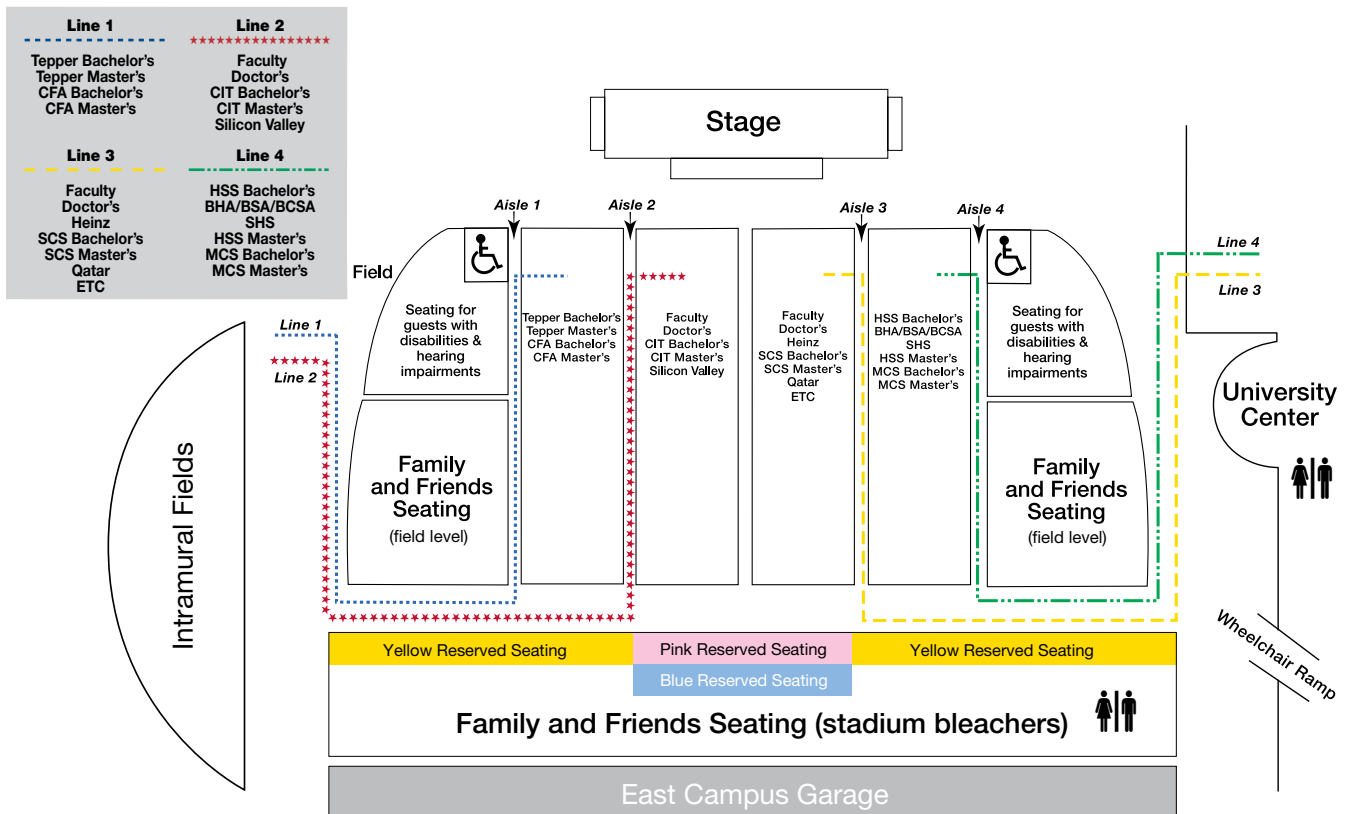


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ROBING AND PROCESSION MAP

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FAQ

Main Commencement Ceremony

Where should guests sit?

Guest seating is available in the stadium bleachers or in designated areas on the field. A seating map is available on page 7.

Can I reserve seats?

Any attempt to “reserve” your seats is based on the understanding and cooperation of other guests. It is advisable to keep a member of your party with your seats at all times.

Is there seating for special needs guests at the main commencement ceremony?

Yes; these sections are on the field (see the map on page 7). Up to three guests are permitted to sit in this section with a special needs guest. No tickets are necessary.

Where can I take pictures/video?

During the procession, photographers may stand along the track, but may not interfere with the procession. We ask that all guests remain seated during the ceremony and recession. You may wish to ask the appropriate academic department about photography at diploma ceremonies.

Can I view the ceremony from an indoor location?

Yes, the ceremony will be broadcast in McConomy Auditorium, first floor, University Center. Seating is first-come, first-served. No tickets are required.

Is there a webcast?

Yes. More information is available on the commencement website.

Diploma Ceremonies

What are diploma ceremonies?

All graduating students will receive their diplomas at department or school diploma ceremonies. A complete schedule is on page 4.

Are there shuttles to off-campus diploma ceremonies?

Yes. Shuttles to and from the off-campus diploma ceremony sites will be available on Sunday beginning at 12:30 p.m. There is limited parking at off-campus locations so the shuttles are recommended. For more information, please see page 5.

Sunday, May 15

With an anticipated 10,000 commencement guests and 16,000 marathon participants, these two incredible events will make for quite a busy weekend in Pittsburgh!

The university has been working diligently with marathon staff to ensure that commencement guests are impacted as little as possible. To make your visit to CMU and Pittsburgh a pleasant one, we encourage you to read the below information carefully:

Race Course and Road Closures

- A map of the marathon course and a list of road closures are posted on the commencement website.

Directions

- There will be heavy traffic throughout the city. **Plan accordingly and allow plenty of travel time.**
- Turn-by-turn directions from area hotels, circumnavigating the marathon route, will be available on the commencement website and at the front desk of each hotel listed on that website.
- Driving directions to campus from the four cardinal directions, circumnavigating the marathon route, are listed on page 13.

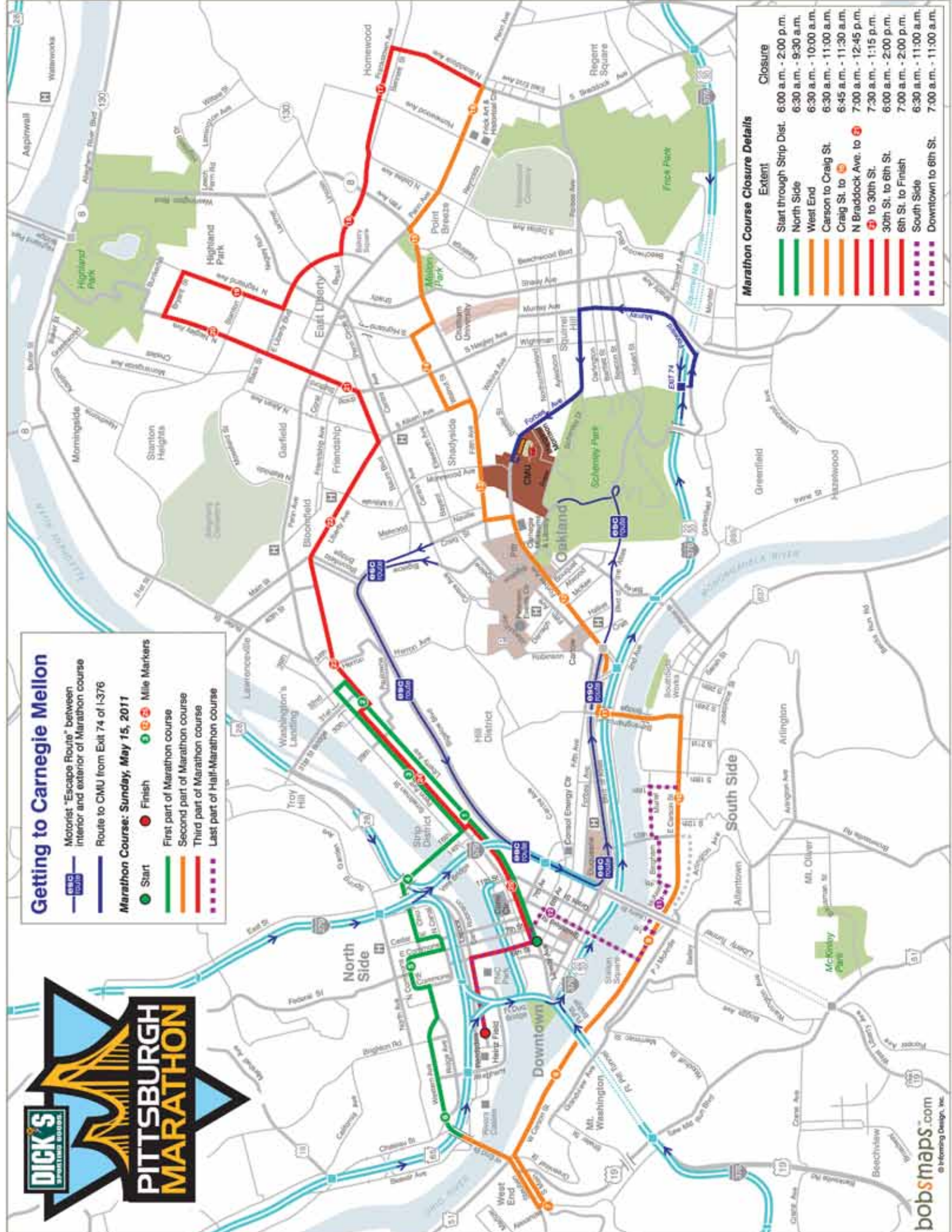

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DIRECTIONS

These directions will take you to campus, while avoiding the marathon route. Please do not use a GPS or internet mapping site. They might not accurately reflect all road closures.

Getting to the I-376 Squirrel Hill Exit 74 or to the Boulevard of the Allies

From the South and Airport area

- Take I-376 East and continue through the Fort Pitt Tunnel.
- Cross the bridge and take the right ramp to continue on I-376 East toward Monroeville.
- Take Exit 74 Squirrel Hill, then follow the directions in the next column.

From the West/Ohio River Valley

- Take PA-65 South, Ohio River Boulevard, toward downtown Pittsburgh.
- As you pass Heinz Field, take the right lane toward I-376 East/Fort Pitt Bridge to cross the Fort Duquesne Bridge.
- Get in the second lane from the right and follow signs toward I-376 East toward Monroeville.
- Follow signs toward I-376 East toward Monroeville.
- Take Exit 74 Squirrel Hill, then follow the directions in the next column.

From the North and Northeast

- Take I-279 South to PA-28 South or I-579 South to cross the Veterans Bridge.
- Follow signs toward I-376 East toward Monroeville.
- This will take you to the Boulevard of the Allies, then follow the directions in the next column.

From the East/Monroeville

- Take I-376 West toward Pittsburgh.
- Take Exit 74 Squirrel Hill, then follow the directions in the next column.

From the East End/Shadyside/East Liberty (interior of the marathon course)

- Take Centre Avenue toward downtown Pittsburgh and make a right on to Craig Street.
- Follow Craig Street up the hill, where it merges with Bigelow Boulevard.
- As you approach downtown, follow signs toward I-376 East toward Monroeville.
- These signs will lead you to I-579 South/Crosstown Boulevard and the Boulevard of the Allies, then follow the directions in the next column.

Follow-up Directions

From I-376 Exit 74 Squirrel Hill

- Off the exit ramp, turn left on to Forward Avenue.
- At the first traffic signal, bear left on to Murray Avenue.
- Continue up the hill and turn left on to Forbes Avenue. (There will be a Rite-Aid on your left.)
- This will take you directly to campus. The entrance to the East Campus Garage is reached via a driveway on the left, just past the garage and opposite Devon Street.

From the Boulevard of the Allies

- Take the Boulevard of the Allies away from downtown Pittsburgh, into Schenley Park.
- After crossing the bridge into the park, take the second ramp on the right (marked by a big orange sign saying "Oakland").
- Follow the ramp and cross the Panther Hollow Bridge, then bear left at the three-way intersection and go past Phipps Conservatory.
- Turn right on to Frew Street. A small driveway on the left (marked "Roberts Drive") will lead you to the Gates Garage.
- If you'd prefer to park in the East Campus Garage, continue on Frew Street and make a left on to Tech Street.
- At the bottom of the hill, turn right on to Margaret Morrison Street.
- Follow this street to the traffic signal and turn left on to Forbes Avenue.
- The entrance to the East Campus Garage is reached via a driveway on the left, just past the garage and opposite Devon Street.
