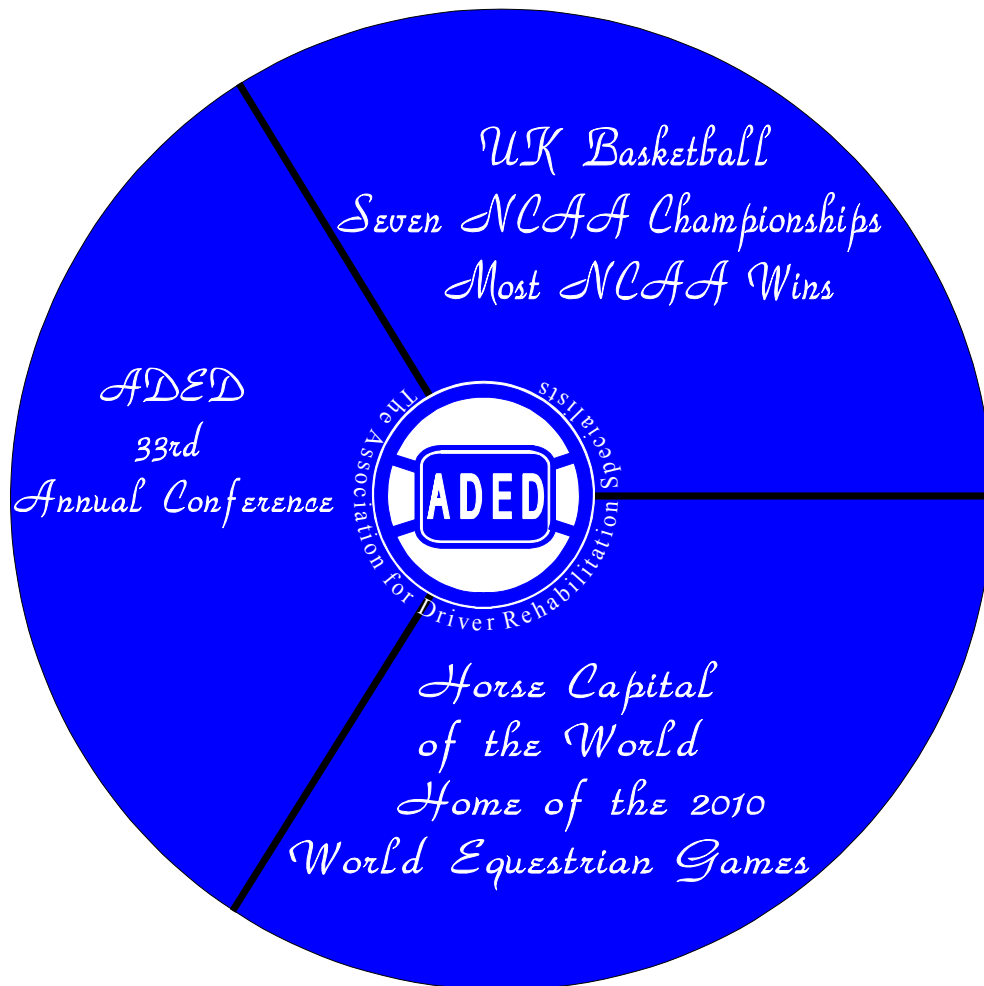

Course 1: FUNDAMENTALS OF DRIVER REHABILITATION

A. Towards Ecologically Valid Assessments of Driving Ability **I** **Rosamond Gianutsos, Ph.D., CDRS**

Abstract: Driver Rehabilitation depends on evaluation of the abilities essential for safe driving, including attention, memory, cognition, language, abstract thinking, speed of processing, motor planning and executive control functions. Awareness (metacognition) of these capabilities is as important as the abilities themselves. Many of the assessments used in clinical driver evaluations lack apparent, or ecological, validity and hence are often perceived as irrelevant. Significantly, behind-the-wheel assessment possesses ecological validity, but lacks demonstrated reliability and validity. Using examples, this workshop will address the challenge of developing ecologically valid assessments for driver rehabilitation. **Contact Hours: 7**

B. Driver Rehabilitation: Evaluation and Treatment of Adolescents with Cognitive and Social Skill Limitations **I** **Miriam Monahan “Watson”, OTR/L, CDRS**

Abstract: Students with Asperger’s syndrome, non-verbal learning disabilities, autism and students with lower IQ scores often present a challenge to the driver rehabilitation specialist. This seminar will provide participants with unique tools for assessment and treatment. Participants will gain useful information on how to assess a student’s visual search skills, maturity level, and cognitive skills for driving. Participants will also walk away with activities to assist these students receiving driver rehabilitation services. **Contact Hours: 7**

Abstract: This workshop will explore the basics of the highway transportation system. It will address the physical laws of driving. Basic lesson plans will be discussed and helping your new driver use his visual scanning skills will be covered. It will look at designing a road test route. - 1. Passage of WV House Bill 4139: What the future holds for Bioptic Lens users who wish to explore the driving privilege!** **B**
Charles Huss, COMS, Consultant-Biopic
Abstract: Over the past thirty (30) years there has been a gradual yet significant advancement and acceptance of the use of bioptic lens systems for driving by persons with mild to moderate levels of central vision loss by a majority of states. WV House Bill 4139 passed in 2008 authorized and required the WV Division of Rehabilitation Services in collaboration with the WV Division of Motor Vehicles to develop and implement a multi-disciplinary bioptic driver training and driver testing program. This presentation will provide an overview of : the consumer driven advocacy efforts that spurred passage of this bioptic driving related legislation; admission criteria; the model multi-disciplinary training and testing approach that was developed and awaits implementation (2009); criteria for completion of driver training, comprehensive driver license testing and transfer of driver licensure; license restrictions and removal thereof; license renewal criteria; and regulatory practices of Class G driver license (for biopic users). **Contact Hours: 3**

- 4. Improving Safety for Wheelchair-seated Drivers** **I**

Abstract: This seminar will provide driver rehabilitation specialists, trainers, vehicle modifiers and evaluators with recourses that will help improve the safety of people who drive a vehicle while seated in their wheelchairs. The seminar will include results from a study that assessed the current state of wheelchair driver safety. Safety issues will be reviewed that are related to the type of wheelchair system used and especially the armrest configuration, the wheelchair securement system, the type and configuration of lap and shoulder belts, the availability of steering-wheel airbags, and the need for head and back support. Emerging concepts for improved driver restraint systems for both front and rear impacts will be described. **Contact Hours: 3**

6. Understanding the Impact of Visual Deficits on Achieving Successful Outcomes Behind the Wheel **B/I/A**
Cyndee Crompton, MS, OTR/L, CDRS and Barry Kavanaugh, Jr. OD, FAAO, FCOVD

Abstract: A thorough evaluation of visual skills related to binocular efficiency and use of the central and peripheral systems is imperative in understanding why certain behind the wheel impairments present themselves, including difficulty in maintaining a centered lane position, problems with turns and curves, and difficulty in inclement weather conditions. A thorough clinical assessment will provide clues regarding anticipated problems behind the wheel. Specific case studies will be used to emphasize the learning. Through a co-led seminar the essential teamwork between the driver rehabilitation specialist and the neuro-optometrist will be modeled.

Driver Competence: Can ADED have a clear and valued role in this B/I/A

Emerging public health question?

Abstract: Various professionals, special policymakers, licensing authorities and community stakeholders are increasingly concerned with older driver competence and driving options. The specialty field of driver rehabilitation should be represented as a major player at the decision-making table when older driver competence issues are being discussed and policies created and developed. Most typical driver evaluation programs known to ADED are staffed by allied health or driver education professionals and driver instructors; however, there are many more parties and professionals involved with the multi-faceted issues of the older driver and their continued safe mobility in the community. A fact today is that community agencies, physicians' offices, research centers and senior centers, to name a few, have created and are using their own screening, evaluation and education approaches to addressing their older driver concerns. ADED's participation and collaboration now with these parties is critical to ensuring our membership's role and value in the area of older driver issues.

This presentation will challenge the practice of driver rehabilitation to broaden its influence and expertise to address contemporary questions, consumer-driven services and needs of a broad range of stakeholders. To focus ADED's vision for the future, we must become aware of all multi-disciplines that are involved with driver competence issues and begin a collective and bipartisan collaboration. As a person involved with all these parties, Elin Schold Davis will present ideas for collaboration that are needed for capacity building, awareness and growth of the field in addressing driver competency. As ADED's current President, Susan Pierce will emphasize ADED's important role in these issues for ages to come and encourage the development of ideas for ADED's participation so that its members can have a value in this emerging health policy. **Contact Hours: 1**

TWENTY-ONE FREEBIES IN THE BLUEGRASS

1. Watch an early morning workout at *Keeneland Race Course* or the *Red Mile Harness Track* — or take a self-guided track tour. Keeneland: (859-254-3412 or 800-456-3412) The Red Mile: (859-255-0752)
2. Rev up your knowledge of a new kind of Kentucky horsepower at *Toyota Motor Manufacturing Kentucky, Inc.*, in Georgetown, where Toyota automobiles and engines are made for the world market. (800-866-4485)
3. Explore the spirited Kentucky tradition of bourbon-making by touring *Buffalo Trace*, maker of Ancient Age (502-696-5926 or 800-654-8471) *Four Roses* (502-839-3436) or *Wild Turkey Bourbon distillery* (502-839-4544)
4. Snap a "photo finish" at the Lexington's *Thoroughbred Park*, Main and Midland streets, where realistic, life-size bronze horse statues race and graze.
5. Thrill to our version of "Palisades Park" — the 734-acre *Raven Run Nature Sanctuary*, where hiking trails wind through meadows, woodlands and along streams in the scenic Kentucky River Palisades area. (859-272-6105)
6. Take a memorable (and memorial) stroll through *Lexington Cemetery*, nationally recognized for its arboretum and gardens, and final resting place of Henry Clay, Confederate General John Hunt Morgan, basketball coach Adolph Rupp and other famous Lexingtonians. (859-255-5522)
7. Do some water-watching (and people-watching), day or night, in front of the cascading wall of fountains at downtown's *Triangle Park*, corner of Main and Broadway. Or stop at the unique fountains in front of the courthouses on North Limestone for more water wonders.
8. Explore the area at your own pace using the *Lexington Walk and Bluegrass Country Driving Tour*, available at the Convention and Visitors Bureau, 301 East Vine Street. (859-233-7299 or 800-845-3959)
9. Visit Kentucky Derby winners and other famous equine residents of the Bluegrass at area *horse farms*; the Lexington Convention and Visitors Bureau can tell you which farms allow visitors. (No admission charge, but tipping is recommended.) (859-233-7299 or 800-845-3959)
10. Stroll back in time in *Gratz Park*. Lexington's poshest neighborhood of the early 1800s and still a scenic and charming place to live. (North Mill and Market streets between Second and Third.)
11. Go to the source of Lexington, *McConnell Springs*, where in 1775, frontier explorers got word of the first battle of the American Revolution at Lexington, Massachusetts, and decided to name their campsite in its honor. On Rebm Lane, off Old Frankfort Pike. (859-225-4073)
12. Drive or bike along *Old Frankfort Pike (1681)*, officially designated one of America's Scenic Byways.
13. Take a "plant walk across Kentucky" and view other gardens at the *Arboretum*, Alumni Drive in Lexington. (859-257-6955)
14. Promenade through a formal English parterre garden, or stroll grounds once walked by the "Great Compromiser" himself, Henry Clay, at *Ashland*, the Henry Clay Estate, 120 Sycamore Road in Lexington. (859-266-8581)
15. Jog or walk through *Masterson Station Park*, or follow the fitness trail at *Shillito Park*, both in Lexington. (859-288-2900)
16. Ponder Lexington's Civil War-era history on the grounds of the Fayette County Courthouse, where you'll find *Cheapside Park*, site of one of the South's largest slave markets, and a statue of Confederate General John Hunt Morgan, who lived in Lexington.
17. The beautiful Romanesque stone building in the center of downtown Lexington is now home to the *Lexington History Museum* and the *Lexington Public Safety Museum*. Once the county courthouse, it now houses the city's newest attraction, and plans are underway for its complete restoration. Open Friday through Monday. (859-254-0530)
18. Discover bridges to the past: Drive across one of Kentucky's 12 remaining *covered bridges*, the *Colville Covered Bridge*, on KY 3118 northwest of Millersburg. In Fleming County, northeast of Lexington, you can admire not just one, but three, lovely old covered bridges.
19. Honor veterans of the Civil War and other wars at *Camp Nelson National Cemetery and Civil War site*, off US 27 south of Nicholasville. (859-885-5727)
20. Visit the *Kentucky Artisan Center* just outside Berea for wonderful overview of Kentucky's hand crafted heritage. (859-985-5448)
21. Take a 250 year old shortcut. Follow *Tates Creek road* out of Lexington and you'll end up on the banks of the Kentucky River. If you want to go any further, you'll have to take the *valley view Ferry*. The schedule can be affected by weather, so call ahead to make sure it's running. (859-258-3611)

ADED MENTOR PROGRAM

new for 2009!

Purpose: To establish a network that will provide an opportunity for experienced members to meet newer members (1st or 2nd time ADED attendees) with a goal of welcoming, mentoring, and integrating them into the Association. It is expected that with mentoring, new members would have a positive first experience with ADED, therefore increasing the likelihood of greater participation and longevity. Additionally, the more experienced members would continue to grow as they interact with those with less experience.

Benefit: The most immediate benefit would be establishing a sense of belonging. Longer term benefits would include building an informal network within the organization that would include members from the various professional backgrounds, increasing membership longevity, and offering a way for more experienced members to “give back” to ADED.

Process: The mentoring “team” would include one person from the Driver Education background, one from the Rehabilitation background, and one from the Mobility Equipment background. Every effort will be made to help the new member establish contact with a Mobility Equipment Dealer in their geographical area.

Responsibilities: The purpose of the Mentoring Program is not to require an intense, long term teaching/training period, but rather to be a resource person while the newer member becomes familiar with ADED as an organization.

The mentors will be asked to:

- Communicate with the new member prior to the Conference if possible and share their contact information for future reference.
- Make plans to meet them at breakfast on the first morning of the Conference to introduce themselves and other members, then attend the Opening General Session with them.
- Offer guidance in helping them select the workshops that might be beneficial to them and their program.
