

Addresses by the keynote speaker and the student speaker, as well as a charge to the graduates by CMU's president, will highlight the ceremony.

- · No tickets are required.
- The ceremony will last approximately 75 minutes.
- The procession of graduates and ceremony participants into the stadium will begin at 10:15 a.m. Please be seated by this time and remain seated until the end of the recession.
- · Seating is first come, first served.
- The ceremony will take place rain or shine. The stadium is not covered. Please plan your clothing and footwear accordingly. Please do not wear spiked heels into the stadium.
- In the case of rain, complimentary ponchos will be available and the ceremony may be shortened.
- The ceremony will also be simulcast in McConomy Auditorium, University Center. No tickets are required and seating is first come, first served.
- The ceremony will be webcast on the commencement website.
- Graduates will receive their diplomas at their department or school's diploma ceremony; see page 3 for details.

#### **Honors Ceremonies**



#### **Guidelines for Wearing Academic Regalia**


- Cap is worn straight with the shallow part in front.

- Bachelor's degree candidates wear the tassel on the right and move it to the left side after the degree has been conferred.
- Male graduation candidates and faculty should remove caps during the national anthem.

## GENERAL INFORMATION

#### **Parking**

Parking is available in the following locations throughout the weekend. (NOTE: Parking is limited.) Parking is free except where noted. All parking areas are handicap accessible. Please see the map on page 7 for parking locations.

- East Campus Garage
  - ▲ On Sunday, the first floor of the East Campus Garage will be reserved for special needs guests. No prior arrangements are necessary.

# Off-Campus Diploma Ceremony Shuttles 12:30 – 5 p.m.

- Shuttles will run continuously between campus and all off-campus diploma ceremony sites (except Heinz Field for the ETC ceremony). The pick-up and drop-off location is at the corner of Forbes and Morewood Avenues in front of Cyert Hall.

#### Sign Language

- Interpreters will be at the Doctor's Hooding ceremony and the main commencement ceremony.
- They will be positioned in front of the special needs seating sections.
- No tickets or prior arrangements are necessary.

#### Wheelchairs

- We strongly encourage those guests who have difficulty walking to bring or rent a wheelchair for the weekend.
- A limited number of wheelchairs will be available for rental in Wean Commons, University Center, on Sunday. Rates begin at \$15/day.


#### Shuttles

- Wheelchair accessible shuttles will be available on Saturday and Sunday, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.
- The pick-up location is the University Center Circle. Guests can be dropped off at any on or off-campus location.
- No prior arrangements are necessary.

#### **Parking**

- All parking areas are wheelchair accessible.
- On Sunday, the first floor of the East Campus Garage will be reserved for special needs guests.
- No prior arrangements are necessary.







CMU's campus (located in the Oakland section of Pittsburgh) is accessible via the I-376 Squirrel Hill exit 74 or the Boulevard of the Allies. Directions are listed below.

# Getting to the I-376 Squirrel Hill Exit 74 or to the Boulevard of the Allies

#### From the South and Airport area

- Take I-376 East and continue through the Fort Pitt Tunnel.
- Cross the bridge and take the right ramp to continue on I-376 East toward Monroeville.
- Take Exit 74 Squirrel Hill, then follow the directions in the next column.

#### From the West/Ohio River Valley

- Take PA-65 South, Ohio River Boulevard, toward downtown Pittsburgh.
- As you pass Heinz Field, take the right lane toward
   I-376 East/Fort Pitt Bridge to cross the Fort Duquesne Bridge.
- Get in the second lane from the right and follow signs toward I-376 East toward Monroeville.
- Follow signs toward I-376 East toward Monroeville.
- Take Exit 74 Squirrel Hill, then follow the directions in the next column.

#### From the North and Northeast

- Take I-279 South to PA-28 South or I-579 South to cross the Veterans Bridge.
- Follow signs toward I-376 East toward Monroeville.
- This will take you to the Boulevard of the Allies, then follow the directions in the next column.

#### From the East/Monroeville

- Take I-376 West toward Pittsburgh.
- Take Exit 74 Squirrel Hill, then follow the directions in the next column.

#### **Follow-up Directions**

#### From I-376 Exit 74 Squirrel Hill

- Off the exit ramp, turn left on to Forward Avenue.
- At the first traffic signal, bear left on to Murray Avenue.
- Continue up the hill and turn left on to Forbes Avenue. (There will be a Rite-Aid on your left.)
- This will take you directly to campus. The entrance to the East Campus Garage is reached via a driveway on the left, just past the garage and opposite Devon Street.
- If you'd prefer to park in the Gates Garage, take Forbes Avenue to Margaret Morrison Street and turn left.
- Turn left on to Tech Street.
- Turn right on to Frew Street.
- Turn right on to Roberts Drive.
- Bear left at the stop sign and continue down the hill.
   The entrance to the Gates Garage will be straight ahead approximately 100 yards beyond the stop sign at the bottom of the hill. A shuttle will be available to transport guests to Gesling Stadium.

#### From the Boulevard of the Allies

- Take the Boulevard of the Allies away from downtown Pittsburgh, into Schenley Park.
- After crossing the bridge into the park, take the second ramp on the right (marked by a big orange sign saying "Oakland").
- Follow the ramp and cross the Panther Hollow Bridge, then bear left at the three-way intersection and go past Phipps Conservatory.
- Turn right on to Frew Street. A small driveway on the left (marked "Roberts Drive") will lead you to the Gates Garage.
- If you'd prefer to park in the East Campus Garage, continue on Frew Street and make a left on to Tech Street.
- At the bottom of the hill, turn right on to Margaret Morrison Street
- Follow this street to the traffic signal and turn left on to Forbes Avenue.
- The entrance to the East Campus Garage is reached via a driveway on the left, just past the garage and opposite Devon Street.



#### **Main Commencement Ceremony**

#### Where should guests sit?

Guest seating is available in the stadium bleachers or in designated areas on the field. A seating map is available on page 5.

#### Can I reserve seats?

Any attempt to "reserve" your seats is based on the understanding and cooperation of other guests. It is advisable to keep a member of your party with your seats at all times.

# Is there seating for special needs guests at the main commencement ceremony?

Yes; these sections are on the field (see the map on page 5). Up to three guests are permitted to sit in this section with a special needs guest. No tickets or prior arrangements are necessary.

#### Where can I take pictures/video?

During the procession, photographers may stand along the track, but may not interfere with the procession. We ask that all guests remain seated during the ceremony and recession. You may wish to ask the appropriate academic department about photography at diploma ceremonies.

#### Can I view the ceremony from an indoor location?
