

## **Cliff Nass Questions (from Fulk)**

This reading comes built-in with commentary and starred passages courtesy of my reading of the text several years ago.

(1) Form. Nass makes an interesting point that form determined by sociality often forces a new technology form to retain aspects of old technology that are technically irrelevant. Choose a mobile robot application domain and, for that application, think of such a “legacy feature” that one may choose to include. Tell the tale as to why.

(2) Table 3.1, Variables for Technology as “box”. Do an extension to human-interactive robotics for this list. For each listed variable that you deem has relevance to human-robot interaction, explain how it would be instantiated as a variable for an interactive robot (a sentence defining the variable in the context of a robot interacting with humans).
