- Normal Mode
 - Commands
- Insert Mode
 - Editing
- Text Objects
 - o d, c, w
 - But wait, there's more!
- Undo/Redo
 - o u to undo
 - o :redo to redo



More Modes!

- Visual Mode
 - v, allows you to select text
- Visual Line
 - V (capital V), Selects whole line
- Visual Block
 - Ctrl-v, Selects a rectangle
 - I (capital I), Lets you do mass edits from Visual Block Mode

Text Objects

- Text objects have a distinct form.
 - < number><command><text object or motion>

More Text Objects!

- i and a
 - da(deletes anything inside matched parens (and the parens)
 - ci} changes things inside {curly braces}
 - Works with most delimiters: " { [('` <, probably more
- t and p
 - Let you delete/change the contents of an html tag or paragraph, respectively


Substitutions!

- Find and Replace, but with Vim and regex!
 - o :s/<find>/<replace>/<flags>
- Ranges
 - Go before the s
 - o :10,30s/foo/bar
 - :%s/foo/bar/g
